- Part VI of Framework
- "39. Member economies should make known to APEC domestic implementation of the Framework through the completion of and periodic updates of the Individual Action Plan (IAP) on Information Privacy."

Important Issues for those Developing a Domestic Framework

- Scope
- Principles
- Implementation

Scope

- Whole/part economy?
- Single multiple schemes?

- Important Issues
 - Complete scheme
 - Compatibility
 - flexibility

Principles

- Translation into law (or enforceable rules)
- Content, drafting
- Exceptions, exemptions, interaction with other laws
- Modifications for sectors etc
- Important issues
 - Clear understanding
 - Compatibility
 - flexibility

Implementation (1)

- Promote compliance (encourage good practice e.g. education, audit, PIA)
- Consumer education of rights and risks
- Dispute resolution
- Remedies when privacy is violated

Implementation (2)

- Important Issues
 - Who does what? Multi-function agency (e.g. privacy commissioner) or distribute functions
 - Functions: education, access reviews,
 complaints, enforceable remedies
 - Other possible functions: research advice to government
 - Civil (redress) or criminal (punishment)?

Some concluding thoughts (1)

- APEC economies' experience to study, opportunity for new starters to "leap frog" to a logical endpoint of suitable all-of-economy scheme
- Existing Asia-Pacific models offer comprehensiveness with flexibility through codes of practice supplementary law

Some concluding thoughts (2)

• Consider the usefulness of having a privacy commissioner or similar, as implementation is a continuing and challenging issue, not a "one off" task, commissioners can be a valuable resource for governments as well as being well suited to public education, industry training and low level dispute resolution
